The Beginning

After having done work in the Gauteng area for almost 3 years I decided to register my own organisation in an effort to better serve the Gauteng Community. I was born in Gauteng and have lived here all my live. I am very passionate about the Gauteng community and giving a helping hand where I can to those in need. The EPIC Foundation was registered on 24 April 2013 with the help of the legal firm of Webber Wentzel. We officially started operating on 1 June 2013.

My Story

I have myself experienced various traumas in my life and have an understanding of how lonely it can be if there is no one giving you a helping hand to work through these experiences. This has encouraged me to do the work I do and to register the EPIC Foundation as I would like to be that helping hand to those in need. I, quite unexpectedly, was nominated and selected **for Hero of the Month of June through Lead SA**. This was a huge privilege to me. Together with this I had the opportunity of sharing my personal story with the Gauteng community on Radio 702, 94.7, the Star Newspaper and Pretoria News. My story was not an easy one to tell, being a rape survivor myself, but I realised by talking about what happened to me I could be an encouragement and help to others out there who might be dealing with the same difficulties in their lives.

Our first initiative

We were fortunate enough through the assistance of Primedia to have the public give donations for our Comfort Pack Project at all Timberland Stores after a request in the Star newspaper. Our first donation to the EPIC Foundation through this consisted of 26 boxes of bags and content items enough to fill 500 bags to be send out to crisis centres! Alberton City Mall Management adopted the EPIC Foundation as their official charity and is sponsoring us with a lovely shop space to run our projects from. This has been a huge blessing for us having access to the public, not just to get support, but also to be in a place where survivors have access to us for further assistance and referrals.





Our accomplishments so far

We have established a good network to distribute these comfort packs all over the Gauteng province to ensure that these bags get to as many survivors as possible. We also have systems in place where we keep track of the bag distribution via a numbering system, a bag register and a feedback form from centres to ensure that these bags end up in the right hands. Since registration we have been sending out on average 150 bags a week to centres over the province. We are proud to announce that the donations from the firms and Gauteng community have enabled us to do this.

The feedback received from these centres on the impact of these bags has been tremendous. It makes a significant difference to the survivors at a point when they are at their lowest, especially so for the children.

I do motivational talks and have had several bookings during August for Women's month and have already received a few bookings for the 16 days of Activism period.

I have presented a few awareness campaigns/talks which has received positive response. There are so many people out there who do not know want to do if they are a victim of rape and abuse.



We have teamed up with Mark Grobbelaar (friend of Alison - rape survivor) of WomenInpowered to provide self-defence classes specifically for women. Our aim with Mark is that we might not be able to do anything about the rapist, but we can empower woman with skills to help them get out of and avoid situations where they could be raped. Step-up programme


